





Property Taxes:

The municipal tax portion has an average tax increase of 0.90%.

After a freeze in 2024-25, Provincial education property tax rates will increase in 2025-26 to support Alberta's schools. This results in a 7.46% increase for Silver Beach residents.

Reduce Wildfire Damage at Your Lake Home:

Advice from FireSmart Alberta

- Remove all combustible ground cover, such as mulch and plants, within one and a half meters of the house perimeter.
- Install non-combustible ground surfaces within 1.5 m of the home (mineral soil, rock, concrete or stone).
- Remove needles, leaves and debris from gutters, roof surfaces, decks and balconies. Regularly clean vents.
- Remove conifer trees that are within ten meters of the house.
- Mow the lawn to less than ten centimeters and plant low-growing, well-spread shrubs and other fire-resistant plants.
- Prune trees to create a two-meter clearance from the ground to the lowest tree branches.
- Replace worn or missing weather stripping on all doors, including garage doors.
- Add a non-combustible 3 mm screen to all external vents except dryer vents.
- Create a 15 cm ground-to-siding non-combustible clearance (e.g. install cement board or metal skirting.)

Note: Not all actions will be applicable to each home. Completing these steps does not guarantee the prevention of fire.
